### Principal's Message:

Jason thanked parents for patience with the busses regarding the times, locations and drop offs of the students. He assured parents that he will take care of it if there are any further concerns. We are in the process of hiring a night time custodian, once all the paperwork goes through the district. MAP testing has begun this week, kids usually take an hour to an hour and a half. This is a research based and norm referenced test used by students across the nation. This is a way to track growth to determine if each student is progressing as expected. These scores are used to determine the students' needs. Band and Orchestra begins this week. A few of people have stepped to take over E-club and information will be coming home soon. Odyssey of the Mind (OM) will be co-led by Shauna Thomas Robin Yewell this year. October 6<sup>th</sup> is the date set to re-seed the Forever Green. Stephanie Garcia, a first grade parent, has been researching and coordinating this process. Another parent is providing a donation toward seeding. There

will be an invite to sign up to participate and to provide the needed materials. There is an upcoming lock down drill. Notice will be sent home to parents to provide awareness that it will take place. There will also be information distributed about an evacuation process in the event of an emergency, such as a gas leak or flooding. Emergency protocols will be put together for such an event.

### Chrome books

Chrome books are still needed for Kindergarten and first grade for the students to complete their daily Waterford sessions. The Amphi Foundation will be providing some chrome books, but more are needed. The idea was raised to make this a public discussion during the Direct Giving Campaign. The district goal is to put five laptops in every classroom in the district. This requires further research and consideration.
